On January 15, 2026, Dr. Joan H. Shepherd, President of WAPCNM, paid a working visit to the Secretariat in Yaba, Lagos.

A general meeting was held with the staff of the secretariat. A warm hand of thanks was extended to the executive secretary and staff for their great contributions towards keeping the College up and running.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Strong support for the Fellowship Programme:

The President reaffirmed that the Fellowship remains central to the College's mission. The Secretariat's processes, record-keeping, and communication will be strengthened to serve Fellows and Fellowship Candidates better.



Improved records and archiving:

The College will enhance both electronic and physical archives and maintain an updated asset register. Fellows and Fellowship Candidates may be invited to support the Secretariat on short rotations as part of their exposure to WAPCNM's wider work.

Teamwork at the Secretariat:

Staff were encouraged to work more closely together so that services to Fellows – from registration to examinations and communication – are timely and professional. The President also held individual conversations with staff to hear their views and expectations.

Wellbeing of Fellows and staff:

Reflecting on the recent loss of some Fellows, the President encouraged everyone to take their health seriously and to support one another as a professional family.

Leading WAPCNM into a New Season of Growth and Accountability

During Day 2 of her visit to Nigeria, our President, Dr Joan H. Shepherd, met with the incoming Executive Secretary, outgoing Executive Secretary, and Senior Stakeholders of the WAPCNM Nigerian Chapter to discuss how WAPCNM can better serve Fellows, Residents, and partners.

Key Highlights include:

1. **renewed commitment** to the Abuja project as a permanent home for the College;
2. **Plans to renovate and rebrand the Lagos Secretariat**, so that our administrative base truly reflects the image of the College;

3. **Focus on financial sustainability**, including better budgeting, maintaining College vehicles, exploring investments (such as hostels), and raising funds;
4. **Efforts to strengthen recognition and visibility** of the Fellowship programme at national and regional levels;
5. **Improvements in administrative systems**, including procurement, internal audit, and clearer policies for staff; and
6. **Steps to expand the College journal's reach**, including digital and online sales options.

President Dr Joan H. Shepherd is leading a listening-driven reform agenda to strengthen WAPCNM's Fellowship, finances and future home in Abuja."

Activity 3 – Abuja Stakeholder Engagement: Deepening Partnerships for Nursing and Midwifery Excellence in West Africa

Visit Spotlight

The mission of the delegation was to:

- Introduce the WAPCNM President and the incoming Executive Secretary;
- Express appreciation for the immense support already given to the College, especially towards the Nurse Consultant cadre and the Abuja land;
- Explore areas for stronger collaboration to advance postgraduate nursing and midwifery in Nigeria and the wider West African region.



The leadership of the West African Postgraduate College of Nurses and Midwives (WAPCNM) paid a series of courtesy and stakeholder engagement visits in Abuja, meeting with the Registrar of the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria (NMCN), the President and leadership of the National Association of Nigeria Nurses and Midwives (NANNM), and the Director of Nursing at the Federal Ministry of Health.

STRENGTHENING TIES WITH THE NURSING AND MIDWIFERY COUNCIL OF NIGERIA

At the NMCN, the Registrar warmly welcomed the delegation and described the visit as historic, noting that it was the first time a WAPCNM President had visited the Council. He congratulated the President on her appointment and highlighted the strong contribution of Nigerian Fellows to the College.

The delegation, led by the Immediate Past President and the outgoing Executive Secretary, expressed profound gratitude for the Council's continued support—particularly in relation to the Abuja land, the Nurse Consultancy work, and broader regulatory backing for WAPCNM programmes.



The President reaffirmed that regulatory bodies such as NMCN are pillars of the College and praised their role in nurturing the Nurse Consultant cadre. She emphasised the need to continue attracting senior nurses and midwives into WAPCNM programmes and welcomed NMCN's ongoing collaboration.



Key discussion points included:

- Support for the Abuja land and plans to visit the site;
- Recognition of WAPCNM's growing institutional structure and leadership;
- The importance of harmonised curricula across the region, building on work already done by WAHO;
- The need for a clear strategic plan for the College, increased sensitisation, and stronger publicity.
- Staff suggestions around waivers for Fellowship programmes, scholarships, nurse-led approaches, and increased visibility of WAPCNM's work.

The Registrar encouraged the College to continue building on its progress and reaffirmed his readiness to strengthen collaboration and support WAPCNM's mission.



VISIT TO NANNM HEADQUARTERS: PARTNERSHIP FOR PROFESSIONALISM AND ADVOCACY

At the headquarters of the National Association of Nigeria Nurses and Midwives (NANNM), the delegation was warmly received by the Association's President. He underscored NANNM's shared commitment with WAPCNM to uphold nursing and midwifery excellence and professionalism in Nigeria.



NANNM reaffirmed its commitment to supporting WAPCNM

The outgoing Executive Secretary explained that the visit aimed to introduce the WAPCNM President and incoming Executive Secretary to NANNM and to formally acknowledge the Association's vital contributions, particularly in helping to establish the Nurse Consultant cadre. NANNM leadership pledged that the Association would not relent in supporting this important reform.



The WAPCNM President expressed appreciation for NANNM's steadfast partnership and called for continued advocacy for nursing and midwifery at national and regional levels. She highlighted the need for a strong membership drive to increase engagement with the College and encouraged NANNM to intensify sensitisation among its members.



NANNM shared information on the upcoming Commonwealth Federation of Nurses and Midwives meeting scheduled for 20–24 April 2026, with an invitation for this to be circulated among Fellows and advertised through WAPCNM channels.

ENGAGEMENT WITH THE DIRECTOR OF NURSING, FEDERAL MINISTRY OF HEALTH

In a separate engagement, the delegation met with the Director of Nursing at the Federal Ministry of Health. The outgoing Executive Secretary outlined the mission of the visit—to introduce the WAPCNM President and incoming Executive Secretary, and to express appreciation for the Ministry's longstanding cooperation and support.



The WAPCNM President noted that the visit offered an important opportunity to meet with Nursing and Midwifery in Abuja and to demonstrate, through Fellows' contributions, what the College can achieve for the nursing and midwifery profession. The discussion focused on how WAPCNM and the Ministry can continue to work together to move the College forward, ensuring it stands on equal footing with sister postgraduate colleges in the sub-region.



Key Outcomes and Next Steps

Across all three meetings, there was a strong, shared commitment to:

- Sustain and deepen collaboration between WAPCNM, NMCN, NANNM, and the Federal Ministry of Health;
- Support the development and utilisation of the Nurse Consultant cadre, and advance work on the Abuja land;
- Promote WAPCNM programmes more widely, through increased sensitisation, membership drives, and targeted communication to nurses and midwives;
- Align curricula and programmes with regional efforts led by WAHO and other partners;
- Explore scholarships, waivers, and nurse-led initiatives that will expand access to WAPCNM's Fellowship programmes.



The Abuja visit reaffirmed that Nigerian nursing leadership at regulatory, professional, and ministerial levels views WAPCNM as a key partner in advancing specialist nursing and midwifery practice. The College will now work with these stakeholders to translate the discussions into specific joint activities, including follow-up on the Abuja land, collaborative advocacy, and enhanced support for Fellows and fellowship candidates.

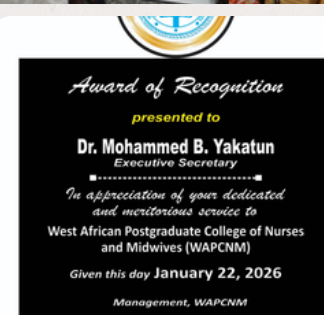
Dr Yakatun outlined some of his achievements, which included:
